Should We Open?

There are RISKS. Associations must act REASONABLY to ensure the SAFETY of their residents and employees. There are likely INSURANCE coverage LIMITATIONS and EXCLUSIONS for COVID-19 related claims. Agreements with the Association's VENDORS & CONTRACTORS may need to be re-visited.



What to Know Before you Go... And Re-Open

What is the risk exposure?

How much will it cost?

Is it possible?

Do we have the staff/resources?

Is it reasonable?

Can it be done safely?



If We Re-Open, How?

- ✓ Clear Signage & Communications
- ✓ Waivers/Acknowledgements
- ✓ Responsible & Enforceable Rules



Examples of Responsible Rules

- Adopt Rules Consistent with Government Advisories & Local Industry Standards
- Prohibit Guests
- Prohibit Use by Individuals Who are COVID-Positive or Who Have Been Exposed to COVID-Positive Individuals

- Limit Occupancy
- Use Advance Registration
- Remove or Cover Common Furniture/Shared Equipment
- Designate Spacing
- Clean and Sanitize....and Clean and Sanitize again



Rules Enforcement

- Who will ENFORCE it?
 - Third Party?
 - Employees?
 - Board?
 - Volunteers?
- What if there are VIOLATIONS?
 - Warnings?
 - Barring use of amenity?
 - Closing the amenity?

Requirements for Re-Opening Businesses

- 1. Follow mandatory workplace SAFETY STANDARDS
- 2. Develop COVID-19 CONTROL PLANS
- 3. Print, sign and post COMPLIANCE attestation poster/self-certification
- 4. Display employer and worker POSTERS
- 5. Comply with applicable INDUSTRY-SPECIFIC rules



Operations Assessment

- Allow remote work
- Devise staggered schedules
- Limit in-person meetings
- Close or limit lunchrooms, conference rooms and common spaces
- Enhance air filtration

- Reduce work travel
- Provide employees PPE
- Implement physical barriers
- Establish cleaning procedures
- Consider parking options available to expand employee transportation options.



Plans & Policies

- Communicating plans to employees.
- Training to employees on COVID-19 plans.
- Evaluating time management (for wage and hour laws)
- Reviewing and updating your handbook policies on leave, hours of operation and work stations.
- Visitor/guest policies

Employees at Higher Risk

- The CDC has identified certain conditions that put people at a higher risk for severe illness if COVID-19 is contracted.
- How should employers handle the "higher risk" employee?
- Handling Reasonable Accommodation Requests
- What if my employee will not show-up because they care for a person who is at high risk?



Preventing Illness in the Workplace

- How do you ensure workers who are sick do not show up?
- Can and should we screen/test employees?
- Requiring employees to wear protective gear
- What if my employee will not wear PPE?
